Report on Joint Training Programme on NDT

CELEBRATION OF TEACHERS' DAY-2011

At the Association of Engineers, India Training Centre, students of Diploma in safety Engg (DIS) of 2011-12 batch celebrated the Teachers' Day on 04.09.2011, instead of 05.09.2011. The programme was inaugurated and conducted by Shri Gopal Ghosal, a student of DIS.

According to him Teachers' Day is completely a different programme unlike that of National Safety Day, Fire Services Day, etc. In this day, student offers respect and honour to the persons, who are involved in such a responsible job of building up human beings. This day is considered as Teachers' Day, because on this day, the great teacher and former President of India, Dr. Sarabapalli Radhakrisnan was born. Everybody pays respect and honour to him. There is a difference between other jobs with the teachers' because they not only share their knowledge with the student but they enlighten and motivate the student. A teacher can turn a bad student into an excellent one by his own capabilities. On behalf of all the students, Shri Ghosal paid honour and respect to the teachers.

Shri Ghosal shared his own experience of his student life. He studied in Narikeldanga High School, Kolkata. In that school, students used to celebrate Teachers' Day every year by offering flowers and pens to the teacher. The programme used to end with light snacks. During that time they did not understand the importance of that auspicious day. But now, the importance of the Teachers' Day is well understood.

The students of the (DIS) class welcomed all the teachers with flowers, greeting cards and pens and requested the teachers to bless them on the occasion.

Mr. C. Chatterjee sent a message to the student-

-"Safety cannot be compromised for anything but everything can be compromised for safety".

-"Make good relationship between teachers and students".

"Feel free to contact me (Er. C. Chatterjee) in case of any problem regarding safety".

Er. C. Chatterjee is a septuagenarian person but this capabilities, determinations, commitments and dedications towards the students are remarkable.

Honorary Secretary Er. Sankar Basu Roy, gave a short speech on this occasion. He said a teacher and a student have a common heart, and still now the students respect teachers as earlier. The teachers of The Association of Engineers, India are experienced, and retired persons, but they are now engaged in building up human resources for global interest.

Er. Subir Seth gave suggestions to the students to acquire knowledge from the teachers as much as they can, because the teachers here are very much experienced, knowledgeable, and were directly related with safety related jobs.

At last Shri Gopal Ghosal said that the problems of teachers are the problems of students and they will do spontaneously for their teachers. He also said that "Darkness stands for ignorance and light is a metaphor for knowledge, energy and hope". This knowledge is given by the teachers. They raise different hopes in students' mind and impart energy in the journey of life. In this journey, one can remember the words of Swami Vivekananda : "In a day when you do not come across any problem you will be sure that you are travelling in a wrong path". In the words of Rabindranath Tagore, "বিপদে মোরে রক্ষা করো এ নহে মোর প্রার্থনা, বিপদে আমি না যেন করি ভয়, যেন করিতে পারি জয়"।

As a representative of all students, Shri Ghoshal heaped respect and honour to the teachers for being with them so long. The programme ended with a happy note followed by light snacks and cold drinks.
