Cement storage effect :

Our last issue contains an article by Sri N. K. Das entitled, "Effects of Storing Cement for long periods and necessity for standardisation," which could not be referred to in the editorial notes.

It deserves special attention as it refers to a matter of great national importance to the country in regard to the economy and safety of its structures.

In that article particulars are given of reduction of strength in storage. This should be taken into account in design of structures; and every step possible must be taken to ensure that the time elapsed in storage is known to the designer of the structure. The author gives suggestions as to how this can be done.
