The papers of those speakers which were received late could not be published in full, except the synopsis. Their articles would be published in the subsequent issue. The exhibition Calcutta: 2001 will be supplemented by popular talks on the same subject from speakers of various age group and different walks of life.

I hope the deliberations of this conference would be of tremendous help not only to the Government but also to the industrialists, manufacturers and the enterpreneurs to draw up their future "Plan of Action".
