PROFESSIONAL INSTITUTION FOR GEOSCIENTISTS (INDIA)

An independant voluntary professional body for geoscientists called 'The Institution of Geoscientists (India)' has been registered at New Delhi in August, 1985.

The new institution would strive for the growth and application of geosciences in co-operation with the existing voluntary societies and academic institutions in the country and abroad. Awarding of professional competency certificates to 'geosciences' practising professionals, conducting examinations for M.Sc., or M. Tech., equivalent in specialised fields of geosciences and technologies, production of supporting geoscientific manpower by awarding diplomas of the Institution, bringing out professional handbooks, Indian text books and Journals in various fields of geosciences and technologies, introducing standards and norms in the collection, synthesis, reporting, coding and retrieval of geoscientific information, encouraging self or cooperative employment amongst geoscientists, recognising infrastructural centres for assisting practising geoscientists and above all encouraging welfare activity amongst geoscientists, are some of the important activities proposed by the Institution.

Members will be allotted to five faculties of the Institution, viz., Geology, Geochemistry, Geoengineering and Technology, and complementary geosciences based on academic qualification. The geochemistry faculty includes analytical chemists engaged in the analysis of earth materials. The geoengineering and technology faculty includes drilling, mining, metallurgy, beneficiation and civil and other engineering branches. The complementary geosciences faculty includes surveying, geography, natural sciences, agricultural sciences, library sciences, space and planetary sciences, computer sciences, etc., as related to earth sciences.
