Smithsonian Research Fellowships in History, Art and Science. The Smithsonian Institution announces its research fellowships for 1988-1989 in the fields of History of Science and Technology, Social and Cultural History, History of Art, Anthropology, Biological Sciences, Earth Sciences, and Material Analysis.

Smithsonian Fellowships are awarded to support independent research in residence at the Smithsonian in association with the research staff and using the Institution's resources. Predoctoral and postdoctoral fellowship appointments for six to twelve months, senior postdoctoral appointments for three to twelve months, and graduate student appointments for ten weeks are awarded. Proposals for research in the following areas may be made:

Earth Sciences: Meteorites, mineralogy, paleobiology, petrology, planetary geology, sedimentology, and volcanology.

Applications are due January 15, 1988. Stipends supporting these awards are: \$25,000 per year plus allowances for senior postdoctoral fellows; \$19,000 per year plus allowances for postdoctoral fellows; \$12,000 per year plus allowances for predoctoral fellows; and \$2,500 for graduate students for the ten-week tenure period. Pre-, post-, and senior postdoctoral stipends are prorated on a monthly basis for periods less than one year.

Awards are based on merit. Smithsonian fellowships are open to all qualified individuals without reference to race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, or condition of handicap of any applicant.
