INSA MEDAL FOR YOUNG SCIENTISTS-1995. Instituted by the Indian National Science Academy in 1974 the Medal is awarded annually in recognition of outstanding work of scientists below the age of 32 (as reckoned on 31st December preceding the year of award). Only those born on or after 1 January 1963 are eligible for consideration in 1995. The work done in India by the nominee will be taken into consideration for the award

The awardee is presented a medal and a cash award of Rs. 10,000. In addition, the recipient is considered for a research grant by the Academy not exceeding Rs. 40,000 per year.

Nominations for the awards for 1995 may be made by Fellows of the Academy, as also by the established scientific societies of all India character, University faculties and departments, or the research institutions. The last date for the receipt of nominations in the Academy is 15 November 1994.
