

India's Jurassic Nest dug up in Tamil Nadu

Dr. M.U. Ramkumar, Lecturer in Geology, Periyar University and his team of research students, have come across clusters of fossilized spherical dinosaur eggs buried in the sands of a river bed at Sendurai village of Ariyallur district. The area is located on the highway between Chennai and Tiruchi. Each egg is stated to be 13 to 20 cm in diameter and were lying in sandy nests. These eggs are believed to be of aggressive Carnosaur and the docile leaf-eating Sauropod. Sufficient precautions have to be taken to protect the site from vandalism by miscreants who have no idea of their value (*Times of India* 1st October 2009). – *Ed.*
