G. Sethumadhava Rao



(1923-2008)

The news of passing away of G. Sethumadhava Rao in the early hours of 5-12-2008 in Pune came as a shock. He was an eminent engineering geologist whose contribution to water and power resources development is commendable. He was a life member of the Geological Society of India.

Sri G. Sethumadhava Rao was born on 15-12-1923 at Bangalore. The eldest son of Sri G. Jairam Rao, a gazetted Railway officer; Sri Sethumadhava Rao completed M.Sc. majoring in engineering Geology from Central College, Bangalore in 1945. After a brief stint as a lecturer in Geology at Central College, he joined Geological Survey of India (GSI) on 11-12-1948. During his service in GSI, he made valuable contribution to the engineering geology. He was

initially associated with the foundation treatment of Hirakud Dam foundation. Later he was involved in a number of major dam projects all over India like Hirakud, Koyna, Bhakra-Nangal, Teesta etc. During his tenure, he was posted to various offices at different loca+tions of the country. He retired as Director, Engineering Geology Division, Eastern Region, Calcutta on 31-12-1981. After 33 years of service in GSI, his contribution to the various irrigation and hydropower projects was recognized by the World Bank and included Sri Rao in their panel for Review of World Bank Aid Projects in Orissa.
