# SOME ADDITIONS TO THE LIST OF PLANTS OF DODA DISTRICT OF JAMMU & KASHMIR

#### ABSTRACT

The paper lists an additional 56 species of flowering plants for Doda district of Jammu & Kashmir. The collections pertain to the Bhaderwah proper and its outskirts forming the part of Bhaderwah tehsil.

Though references to the plants of the Doda district of Jammu & Kashmir have been made by Hooker (1872-97), Blatter (1927-29), Rao (1960) and Sarin (1965), it was not until Kapoor (1968) seriously undertook to bring on record a large collection of plants of this district that a reasonable account of the plants of the area was available. However, much remains to be done in this difficult terrain over which the district extends. A realization of this fact led to the present exploration. In the first instance Bhaderwah and its outskirts have been surveyed and as a result nearly 420 species of flowering plants have been collected. Of these, only those which are hitherto not recorded from Doda district are being enumerated in the present communication.

Bhaderwah, which forms one of the four tehsils of Doba district (the other three being Ramban, Kishtwar and Doda), is situated at the base of thickly vegetated lofty mountains surrounding it on all sides. The valley is nearly V-shaped having a rolling slope and extends about 10 km in length and 3 km in breadth. The lower levels are dominated by Oaks, Deodars and several deciduous elements, while higher up Pines are more common. The alpine ranges covered with green meadows mostly comparising Sieversia alata Royle, Potentilla sp., Anaphalis cuneifolia Hook. f. etc. The area in general is dominated by the members of Ranunculaceae, Cruciferae and Compositae. The explorations were made mostly from Soij, Pedri, Jai, Sarthal, Panaja, Daraja, Sartangal, Gupt Ganga side and other regions on outskirts of Bhaderwah proper.
